FOURTH SUNDAY OF LENT TIME MARCH 10, 2024 GOSPEL

Reading of the holy gospel according to Saint John (9, 1. 6-9. 13-17. 34-38)

As Jesus passed by he saw a man blind from birth. He spat on the ground and made clay with the saliva, and smeared the clay on his eyes, and said to him, "Go wash in the Pool of Siloam" — which means Sent —. So he went and washed, and came back able to see. His neighbors and those who had seen him earlier as a beggar said, "Isn't this the one who used to sit and beg?"

Some said, "It is, " but others said, "No, he just looks like him." He said, "I am." They brought the one who was once blind to the Pharisees. Now Jesus had made clay and opened his eyes on a sabbath. So then the Pharisees also asked him how he was able to see. He said to them, "He put clay on my eyes, and I washed, and now I can see." So some of the Pharisees said, "This man is not from God, because he does not keep the sabbath." But others said, "How can a sinful man do such signs?" And there was a division among them. So they said to the blind man again, "What do you have to say about him, since he opened your eyes?" He said, "He is a prophet." They answered and said to him, "You were born totally in sin, and are you trying to teach us?" Then they threw him out.

When Jesus heard that they had thrown him out, he found him and said, "Do you believe in the Son of Man?" He answered and said, "Who is he, sir, that I may believe in him?" Jesus said to him, "You have seen him, and the one speaking with you is he." He said, "I do believe, Lord," and he worshiped him.

LORD'S WORD



FOURTH SUNDAY OF LENT TIME MARCH 10, 2024



Christ's actions to restore sight to this blind man are loaded with symbolism. First he mixes the dirt with saliva and rubs that mud into his eyes. This gesture recalls the passage from the book of Genesis where the creation of man is narrated as a figure of clay into which the breath of God infuses life. Jesus, by healing that man, is bringing about a new creation. This man, blind from birth, is going to be born again, he is going to start a new life as soon as he can see.

Then Jesus tells him to go wash in the pool of Siloam, and that man goes, washes, and regains his sight. The water of that pool that cleanses your eyes is a symbol of baptismal water, which makes us able to see with the light of faith. The evangelist notes that Siloam means "sent one," but above all he does so to point out that Jesus is that Messenger of God who, when we turn to Him, especially when configured with His death and resurrection in the waters of baptism, makes us capable of to see With this miracle Jesus manifests himself and manifests himself to us as the light of the world; and the man blind from birth represents each of us, who have been created to know God, but because of sin we are like blind people, we need a new light; "We all need a new light: that of faith, which Jesus has given us."

The healing carried out by Jesus provokes a heated discussion, because Jesus performs it on Saturday, violating, according to the Pharisees, the festive precept. Faced with the light that lights up in the blind, the doctors of the law, with an aggressive closure, locked in their presumption and unable to open themselves to the truth, sink deeper and deeper into darkness, determined to deny all evidence: They doubt that the man was really blind from birth and are reluctant to admit the action of God. It is the drama of inner blindness that can affect many people, including each one of us, when we cling to our own opinions or ways of acting, without a sincere openness to the truth, which can be demanding and demand changes of course. In our lives. In parallel, the blind man is traveling a path of growth in faith.

This scene from the Gospel that we meditate today invites us to consider what our attitude is: that of the doctors who, proud, judge others, or that of that blind man who, aware of his needs and limitations, follows what Jesus asks of him., to open oneself to his grace and the light of faith.
