SEPTEMBER 22, 2024 GOSPEL

Reading of the Holy Gospel according to Saint Mark (9:30-37)

Jesus and his disciples left from there and began a journey through Galilee, but he did not wish anyone to know about it. He was teaching his disciples and telling them, "The Son of Man is to be handed over to men and they will kill him, and three days after his death the Son of Man will rise."

But they did not understand the saying, and they were afraid to question him.

They came to Capernaum and, once inside the house, he began to ask them, "What were you arguing about on the way?" But they remained silent. They had been discussing among themselves on the way who was the greatest. Then he sat down, called the Twelve, and said to them, "If anyone wishes to be first, he shall be the last of all and the servant of all." Taking a child, he placed it in their midst, and putting his arms around it, he said to them, "Whoever receives one child such as this in my name, receives me; and whoever receives me, receives not me but the One who sent me."

REFLECTION

This Gospel reading teaches us a very important lesson, that is, the true measure of greatness is not in power, status, or wealth, but in humility and service to others. In our society, it is easy to be tempted to measure ourselves by what we have or what we have achieved. We are often driven by the desire for power, fame, or success. However, Jesus shows us that the real greatness lies in serving others, especially the least among us.

When Jesus used a child as an example, He was saying that we should become like children in our humility, innocence, and dependence on God. Children are not concerned about status, wealth, or power. They are honest, open, and trusting. In the same way, we should strive to be humble, honest, and open-hearted, trusting in God's plan for our lives.

Jesus calls us to be servants of all, just as He was the servant of all. He showed us how to serve by washing His disciples' feet, healing the sick, and feeding the hungry. He even sacrificed His own life for us. He taught us that true greatness comes from serving others and putting their needs before our own.

As we reflect on this Gospel reading, let us ask ourselves, "How can I serve others today?" It doesn't have to be a grand gesture; it can be as simple as helping a neighbor, listening to a friend in need, or volunteering at a local charity. When we serve others, we are following in Jesus' footsteps and showing His love to the world.

Let us pray that God will give us the grace to be humble, to serve others with love, and to become more like children in our trust and dependence on Him. May we always remember that true greatness lies in serving others, and may we strive to live our lives in a way that honors this truth.
