Warning Signs of Abuse in Minors

- No longer wants to see a particular person they had been close to
- No longer interested in activities they used to enjoy
- Changes in **personality**
- Demonstrates aggressive behavior or constantly angry
- Withdraws from family or friends
- Declining academic performance
- Tries to hide use of technology

Warning Signs of Perpetrators of Abuse

- Tries to get minors alone
- Keeps **secrets** with minors
- Allows or encourages minors to break laws or rules
- Gives lavish **gifts** to minors
- Has inappropriate or suggestive conversations with minors
- Does not believe the **rules** apply to them (or, does not follow rules or protocols)
- Takes **photos** without approval, or asks minors to send them photos



How to Report Abuse

If you know or suspect that a minor or vulnerable adult is currently being abused or is in danger, **immediately report** it to state/local law enforcement or the Texas Department of Family and Protective Services at (800) 252-5400 or txabusehotline.org.

Call 9-1-1 in an emergency.
