GOSPEL

Reading of the Holy Gospel according to Saint Luke (3:1-6)

In the fifteenth year of the reign of Tiberius Caesar, when Pontius Pilate was governor of Judea, and Herod was tetrarch of Galilee, and his brother Philip tetrarch of the region of Ituraea and Trachonitis, and Lysanias was tetrarch of Abilene, during the high priesthood of Annas and Caiaphas, the word of God came to John the son of Zechariah in the desert.

John went throughout the whole region of the Jordan, proclaiming a baptism of repentance for the forgiveness of sins, as it is written in the book of the words of the prophet Isaiah: A voice of one crying out in the desert: "Prepare the way of the Lord, make straight his paths, Every valley shall be filled and every mountain and hill shall be made low. The winding roads shall be made straight, and the rough ways made smooth, and all flesh shall see the salvation of God."

REFLECTION

We are called, especially during this Advent season, to prepare to meet the Lord. This second reading reminds us to do this by "conducting [ourselves] in holiness and devotion." We are to let the grace of God transform us and make us holy so we will be prepared for "the day of the Lord," whenever that may be.

In today's Gospel, it is important to remember that the people who approached John the Baptist did not know Christ, as seen in the following chapters. They approached their baptism with a longing for healing or peace, hoping that somehow this ritual could serve as a balm for their restless hearts. I can imagine what they hoped Juan could do for them as they prepared for the ritual. And as they approached, they found hopeful but disappointing news: "One more powerful than me is coming." Juan is not the one they longed to find. Today there is no satisfaction of that desire; instead, only what is necessary to continue the journey is needed.

On this second Sunday of Advent, we live with hope, knowing that suffering and unrest do not have the last word and that He who will bring healing is coming. And yet, we do not shy away from the harsh reality of being people awaiting the arrival of that kingdom. We join the generations before us who linger in the darkness of the night, seeing hints of the approaching dawn, waiting, hoping, and accompanying each other until we share the sunlight.

During the second week, respect, humility and generosity are some of the themes that help us prepare each day until Christmas Eve.


