

## GOSPEL

### Reading of the Holy Gospel according to Saint John (2:1-11)

There was a wedding at Cana in Galilee, and the mother of Jesus was there. Jesus and his disciples were also invited to the wedding. When the wine ran short, the mother of Jesus said to him, "They have no wine." And Jesus said to her, "Woman, how does your concern affect me? My hour has not yet come." His mother said to the servers, "Do whatever he tells you." Now there were six stone water jars there for Jewish ceremonial washings, each holding twenty to thirty gallons. Jesus told them, "Fill the jars with water." So they filled them to the brim. Then he told them, "Draw some out now and take it to the headwaiter." So they took it. And when the headwaiter tasted the water that had become wine, without knowing where it came from – although the servers who had drawn the water knew –, the headwaiter called the bridegroom and said to him, "Everyone serves good wine first, and then when people have drunk freely, an inferior one; but you have kept the good wine until now." Jesus did this as the beginning of his signs at Cana in Galilee and so revealed his glory, and his disciples began to believe in him.

## REFLECTION

The evangelist John tells us in his Gospel the first miracle that Jesus performed. Known as the miracle of the Wedding at Cana, it would be more appropriate to call it The Transmutation of Water into Wine. The symbologies and doctrinal messages hidden in this simple story are many and diverse.

To begin with, the presence of Jesus at a wedding banquet was interpreted by many as the moment of the institution of the Sacrament of marriage, since His presence on that day and in that place would sanctify the union between the groom and the bride in the eyes of God.

Another very important aspect of this evangelical episode is the role that the Virgin Mary plays in it. Mary intercedes before her Son, indicating that the diners have finished the wine, and, in this way, she becomes the bearer of a silent supplication on behalf of the men to Jesus. For the first time, the Virgin stops being just a mother, to become a spokesperson for humanity before Her Son, and instructs those present to follow Her word, abandoning themselves to Her with full confidence: "Do everything He tells you." Mary's presence at the miracle of the Wedding at Cana has an even deeper meaning. In fact, it is the first of the so-called Seven Signs, the seven miracles that in the Gospel of John tell the path taken by Jesus to show the disciples His powers and what He is destined for, before reaching the Last Supper, the Passion and death.

Finally, we must consider the symbology linked to wine, which for the Jews was a very important element, a symbol of joy and sacredness at the same time, elements that cannot be missing at a wedding. Not only that, Jesus transforms the water intended for ritual purification into wine, non-running water, and transforms it into excellent wine, the best.

The wedding at Cana symbolizes the alliance of love between Christ the husband and the Church, his beloved wife. This union of Christ and the Church develops the marital symbolism of God's covenant for his chosen people that we find in the Old Testament. For Christians, however, the miracle that Jesus performs in Cana has a deep Eucharistic meaning. This miracle, which took place very close to the celebration of the Jewish Passover, is a figure of Christ's own Paschal mystery, who offers himself for our sins. The new wine of the wedding at Cana, like the multiplication of the loaves, is a figure of the New Covenant in which Christ gives us his flesh and blood as food and drink.
