

GOSPEL

Reading of the Holy Gospel according to Saint Luke (5, 1-11)

While the crowd was pressing in on Jesus and listening to the word of God, he was standing by the Lake of Gennesaret. He saw two boats there alongside the lake; the fishermen had disembarked and were washing their nets. Getting into one of the boats, the one belonging to Simon, he asked him to put out a short distance from the shore. Then he sat down and taught the crowds from the boat. After he had finished speaking, he said to Simon, "Put out into deep water and lower your nets for a catch." Simon said in reply, "Master, we have worked hard all night and have caught nothing, but at your command I will lower the nets." When they had done this, they caught a great number of fish and their nets were tearing. They signaled to their partners in the other boat to come to help them. They came and filled both boats so that the boats were in danger of sinking. When Simon Peter saw this, he fell at the knees of Jesus and said, "Depart from me, Lord, for I am a sinful man." For astonishment at the catch of fish they had made seized him and all those with him, and likewise James and John, the sons of Zebedee, who were partners of Simon. Jesus said to Simon, "Do not be afraid; from now on you will be catching men." When they brought their boats to the shore, they left everything and followed him.

REFLECTION

It all changed that day when Jesus walked up and said, "Follow Me, and I will make you fishers of men," (Matthew 4:19). That's what we did.

Jesus is the first person with a plan for our lives that actually benefitt both Him and us.At first, Jesus' offer seems as one-sided as anyone else's.

Little by little we realize a difference; He offers a completely new lifestyle that blesses both parties.

God is the only being in the universe who completely cares about us and knows what he designed us to do. He knows us better than we know ourselves. Jesus showed us how to use the power of the Father to free people from disease, demons, and sin. Jesus transforms us.

Serving Jesus in his "fishing" business, blessing others, turns out to be more exciting and satisfying than our dreams.

Observing Jesus allows us to see that he was never selfish; He did not need to be pleased because He was completely satisfied in His Father. As a result, he related to people in a different way. The beginning is to trust in the Father's love for us and His detailed, practical care. That helps us love others, care for them the way God cares for them, and guide them to Him. We don't have to satisfy their misguided demands. If they reject our love and care, it is not really a rejection of us. We move forward and spend time helping those who respond to Jesus' offer by doing what He says.

Now let's throw nets to "catch" them. I would never have imagined such a satisfying business. We are blessed to do so, but it benefits newcomers much more when they begin to follow Him.

Let us be proud to be fishers of men.
