Reading of the Holy Gospel according to Saint John (21: 1-14)

At that time, Jesus revealed himself to his disciples at the Sea of Tiberias. He revealed himself in this way. Together were Simon Peter, Thomas called Didymus, Nathanael from Cana in Galilee, Zebedee's sons, and two others of his disciples. Simon Peter said to them, "I am going fishing." They said to him, "We also will come with you." So they went out and got into the boat, but that night they caught nothing. When it was already dawn, Jesus was standing on the shore; but the disciples did not realize that it was Jesus. Jesus said to them, "Children, have you caught anything to eat?" They answered him,"No." So he said to them, "Cast the net over the right side of the boat and you will find something." So they cast it, and were not able to pull it in because of the number of fish. So the disciple whom Jesus loved said to Peter, "It is the Lord." When Simon Peter heard that it was the Lord, he tucked in his garment, for he was lightly clad, and jumped into the sea. The other disciples came in the boat, for they were not far from shore, only about a hundred yards, dragging the net with the fish. When they climbed out on shore, they saw a charcoal fire with fish on it and bread. Jesus said to them, "Bring some of the fish you just caught." So Simon Peter went over and dragged the net ashore full of one hundred fifty-three large fish. Even though there were so many, the net was not torn. Jesus said to them. "Come, have breakfast." And none of the disciples dared to ask him, "Who are you?" because they realized it was the Lord. Jesus came over and took the bread and gave it to them, and in like manner the fish. This was now the third time Jesus was revealed to his disciples after being raised from the dead.

MAY 4, 2025 REFLECTION

Let us all remember this well: we cannot proclaim the Gospel of Jesus without the concrete witness of our lives. Those who listen to us and see us must be able to read in our actions what they hear on our lips, and give glory to God. Saint Francis of Assisi advised his brothers: preach the Gospel, and if necessary, also with your words. Preach with your lives: with your witness. The inconsistency of the faithful and Pastors between what they say and what they do, between words and their way of life, undermines the credibility of the Church.


But all this is only possible if we recognize Jesus Christ, because it is he who has called us, invited us to walk his path, and chosen us. Proclaiming and bearing witness is possible only if we are close to him, just as Peter, John, and the other disciples were around the risen Jesus, as today's Gospel passage says; there is a daily closeness with him, and they know very well who he is, they know him. The Evangelist emphasizes that "none of the disciples dared to ask him who he was, because they knew it was the Lord." And this is an important point for us: to live an intense relationship with Jesus, an intimacy of dialogue and life, so that we recognize him as "the Lord."


"It is the Lord." This is an experience of Easter joy. This is their story with the Risen One. God fills us when we are empty, when we are hungry, when we are in need. The empty tomb experience of the disciples points to us that we become witnesses of the Risen One because God filled us with His Spirit of Joy, Peace and Love. Those who recognize the Risen One are the ones who experienced His loving presence (enough food, security, being forgiven and loved, etc.). Jesus Christ taught us to give selflessly (His passion and death) and we learn how to receive graciously (that is, we acknowledge that we can only do so much and the rest, we rely on God). What is your experience of Easter joy?
